National Audit Coordinator (12 Months)

(Under the Governance of Mercy University Hospital Cork Ltd.)

The purpose of this post is to coordinate the second Irish National Audit of Dementia (INAD-2) which will be performed in all acute and orthopaedic hospitals in the Republic of Ireland (n= 40 hospitals). The post holder will be accountable to the INAD-2 Steering Group, reporting to the Clinical Lead for the National Dementia Office.

Responsibilities - The post holder will be responsible for;

- Engaging and consulting with key stakeholders to promote the implementation of the audit
- Co-coordinating INAD steering group meetings.
- Tracking the progress of the audit and informing the steering committee of any issues
- Coordinating a review and update of the first round INAD tool by an interdisciplinary expert stakeholder group, thereby developing the INAD-2 tool
- Performing a brief pilot of INAD-2
- Performing the full INAD-2 audit in Irish hospitals, planning and schedule audit site visits, including meetings with senior management and organisation of chart retrieval
- Training, managing and reviewing the work of the local chart auditors (junior doctors local to each site).
- Training and supporting QAVD auditors in their contribution to the audit, especially its quality assurance
- Developing contacts to further the implementation of the audit, including close liaison with the National Dementia Office and the Quality Assurance and Verification Division Quality
- Ensuring compliance with health and safety procedures
- Analysing the audit data and preparing a comprehensive report for dissemination to all relevant local, national and international stakeholders

Eligibility Criteria - Candidates:

- Can be from a clinical or research background. If from the latter, they need a primary healthcare degree and experience of conducting research or audit in acute hospital settings.
- Must have a full drivers license and access to a car
- Require experience of leading and managing a project, or change initiative incorporating project management methodologies, as relevant to the role.
- Require a third level qualification in a health related area.
- Require post-qualification experience of quality assurance, standard setting/accreditation or audit.
